Some seeds take a long time to break through the ground and come to fruition. Shortly after the devastation of Hurricane Katrina, the UCC's Hope Shall Bloom Fund was established and funds began to be distributed in the gulf coast. After more than three years, a Long Term Recovery Organization is still active in Southeast Louisiana and the Hope Shall Bloom funds are still being distributed to those in need. Grant proposals, typically in the amount of \$25,000 are requested through the LTRO and funds from Hope Shall Bloom are used for those grants. But treasure isn't the only asset being used by the National Disaster Ministries team. In 2008, the ministry had a total of 3107 volunteers who logged \$1.4 million worth of volunteer labor in New Orleans. Their new t-shirt designed for National Disaster Ministries volunteers says it all – *Rebuilding Homes. Rebuilding Hope.*

Connecticut Conference's Silver Lake Conference Center Co-Director Tim Hughes said he always wanted to spend his 50th birthday in a warm place. Last summer he and his wife Anne discovered an email from Hawai'i Conference Associate Conference Minister Dorothy Lester inviting them to Hawai'i to lead a mid-winter youth camp. The camp began January 6, Tim's 50th birthday. Tim and Anne, along with Hawai'i Conference adults, welcomed 37 junior and senior high school youth, representing nearly a dozen ethnicities from five islands to the three-night, four-day camp. Outdoor ministry, say Anne and Tim, is important because it is an experience youth don't often find in other places. It is timeless, it reaches youth in new and exciting ways, and it is vital for the future of the church. "We [wanted] the young people of the Hawai'i Conference to have an experience that was transformative and will make them want to come back for more," said Anne.

The Long Beach, CA First Congregational Church's "Downtown Associated Youth Services Committee" (DAYS) is responsible for projects that respond to the needs of young people living in the neighborhoods around the church.

Their annual Summer Day Camp has been a program of love; concern and care to foster personal growth for children ages 4-16 living in downtown Long Beach. Over 10,000 children from some of the city's poorest neighborhoods have participated in the program.

Each year approximately 150 youth spend Monday through Friday, flourishing, for five to nine weeks in a balanced nutrition program with breakfast and lunch provided. Reading and math skills, creative crafts, recreation and field trips keep the campers busy and challenged throughout the summer months.

On a winter night in 1988, as a favor to a friend who could not attend, Elizabeth Sheff, then a Hartford elementary school mother, made her way to a meeting of the Connecticut Coalition for Educational Equity, where she has said, "What I learned at that meeting changed my life." Stunned by the statistic that 70 percent of Hartford's students were reading at the remedial level, Elizabeth submitted her name and phone number when attorneys asked for volunteers to serve as plaintiffs in a future lawsuit. *Sheff v. O'Neill* has slowly yielded the nation's most successful interdistrict magnet school problem and additional structured opportunities for children across Hartford and its suburbs to learn together. For nineteen years, Elizabeth has maintained her witness for justice by persisting as an active plaintiff. Elizabeth Horton Sheff is a true witness for justice.

We can only guess whether a member of the Rev. Paul Elonda's mission group knew that by repairing a bridge on the Congo River that future bridges of ministry and hope would follow. As leader of the Disciples of Christ in the 1960s, "Pasteur Paul" envisioned a strong youth program and the development of rural ministries in the Congo. His dream began to come true after that bridge was built in Ikengo and a group of youth began to meet there for overnight retreats. That ministry, the Pilot Farm, grew with the time and efforts of its first director, Jean Lompala. That ministry today known as the Ikengo Farm continues to flourish because of grants from OGHs and the hard work of the young Congolese director. This agro-pastoral project provides food and hope for the surrounding community – still fulfilling Paul's dream.

Volunteers give their time, talent and support to the mission of ARI – building a just and peaceful society through the training of rural community leaders. ARI achieves its goal by sharing resources in farm management, food preservation and community leadership. Volunteers have come from all over the globe including Germany, Korea, Spain and the USA. Work Camp groups come from churches, boy scout troops and universities, elementary, mid-high and high schools. The camps allow these volunteers to interact with a multi-cultural community, gain a broader world perspective and become more personally involved in and aware of how the food they eat is grown.

Early in 2008, Doug and Liz Searles, long-time Global Ministries missionaries, began what they call a faithful journey towards new horizons, casting their nets in uncharted waters. The Searles felt called to a new ministry to train leadership and laity with the Evangelical Reformed Church in Poland. Fewer than 1% of Poles are Protestant, and in the post-Soviet era, ERC churches there have struggled to not only recover but to grow spiritually and in number. To accomplish this goal, the church leadership asked for a partnership with Global Ministries and the Presbyterian Church, USA. Initially, Doug and Liz trained others to work with small group development, church music and English language teachers. Now, they hope to form an exchange, connecting those that sent them to Poland with those being served. This connection will complete a circle of hope made by throwing wide our arms and opening our hands and hearts to the ERC in Poland.
