

## June 26, 2009—27th General Synod begins

For many, General Synod is a family reunion where the UCC gathers to worship, to engage in service, to do the business of the Synod, to learn, to listen and to grow. "Immerse Yourself" is an apt theme for Grand Rapids as we gather along the Grand River and we immerse ourselves in exploring what it means to live out the call of Jesus Christ as a particular expression of the church. While each Synod includes some of the same elements, each one is an experience in its own right. This year, a spectacular River City Saturday will include an array of speakers, choirs, workshops, Bible Study and an outdoor festival. ## *Our Church's Wider Mission: Changing Lives* *Father's Day*

### June 27, 2009

Empowering people to live healthier, longer lives and teaching how to advocate for those receiving standard care are part of the goals for the Holistic Health Project in Argentina. The program, conducted by former Global Ministries missionary to Paraguay Dr. Ines Sari, offered training sessions through organizations such as the Ecumenical Center for Solidarity, the Women's Forum of the Center for Latin American Issues and local churches. More than 300 families received information on basic health care on issues such as environmental contamination, women's health, sexually transmitted diseases, respiratory illnesses and medical prejudice against the poor, handicapped and homosexuals. A women's workshop was so well-attended that it was extended for several months and culminated with training of 40 women in basic nursing techniques.

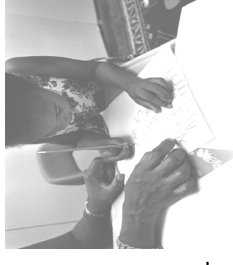

## In the Boat Together

June 21, 2009

### Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time Third Sunday after Pentecost – Proper-7



In an effort to give some new and positive identity to the UCC in the Catawba Valley area of North Carolina, four churches have joined together to seek creative ways to carry out ministry showing that Christ is among us. They have identified their efforts with the name "Linked In New Creative Ministry" (LINC Ministries). The churches involved are Bethel UCC, Church of the Master UCC, Faith Evangelical & Reformed, UCC of Hickory, NC and Memorial UCC in Maiden, NC.

A committee meets once a month to share ideas and plan programs that will better acquaint the people of the communities of faith and reach out to the wider community to acquaint people with the UCC. These four congregations have convened together to cooperate in areas of worship, fellowship, and mission and to look for ways to promote love and understanding. They first came together with the idea of supporting each other and helping strengthen the ministry of each of the churches. The group has planned and presented joint Christmas cantatas, pancake breakfasts and Christmas bazaars, Thanksgiving and Lenten services, and organized a mission trip to Back Bay Mission. One of the members of the organizing group stated: "we believe that God wants us to find common ground for carrying out the ministry of Jesus and we take seriously his prayer 'that they may all be one.'"

## June 22, 2009

## June 23, 2009

If only the waves of violence and the storm of hostility in the Middle East could be calmed as Jesus calmed the waters and the disciples' fears. In March 2008, the National Interreligious Leadership Initiative faxed a letter to U.S. Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice commending her efforts to extend a temporary ceasefire between Palestinian and Israeli forces into a permanent agreement. The statement, signed by UCC General Minister and President the Rev. John H. Thomas, says, in part, that escalating violence in the region has jeopardized a negotiated peace. A comprehensive ceasefire is an essential first step to renew people's hopes that peace is possible. Signers of the letter pledged their support for active, fair and firm U.S. leadership for Arab-Israeli-Palestinian peace and for a two-state solution to the conflict.

## June 24, 2009

The UCC's motto, "That they may all be one" got a little closer to fruition in Missouri during the summer recently. Kirkwood UCC's pastor Gene Ostendorf and Professor Gulien Ilhan, who teaches in St. Louis, decided to blend Muslim and Christian faith traditions into one worship service. It all started when Professor Ilhan came to Kirkwood to teach a course on Islam for the Adult Education Program. A conversation that began with anxiety and mistrust gave way to mutual respect and sharing. The readings came from both the Bible and the Quran – words of Jesus and Muhammad – spoken in English and Arabic. Instead of accentuating differences, worshippers concentrated on similarities – reciting The Lord's Prayer and the story of Jesus' birth from both faith traditions. The church was crowded that Sunday – like an Easter worship gathering it was, a resurrection experience.

## June 25, 2009—52nd Anniversary of the UCC

What is in the UCC Archives? The records, photographs, resources, and objects from around the time of the creating Union in 1957 onward. A selection of a few of the vast resources include: Records from the national offices, UCC Yearbooks, General Synod Minutes, Executive Council Minutes, resources developed by national offices, documentation about the formation of the UCC, and records of projects and initiatives. It also has: Collections from national UCC organizations, committees, councils and groups, the Council for Health and Human Services and the UCC Historical Council. It maintains: Personal papers of people involved in the work of the national setting of the denomination, including those from the Rev. Arthur Clyde's collection of hymnals and the Rev. Harold Wilke's papers documenting his work in the UCC. The UCC Archives works closely with other archives that hold the records of the denominations that united to form the UCC.
